RECOMMENDATION

That the Administration be authorized to transfer \$194,698.41 from the Land Development Reserve to the Asset Revitalization Reserve to fulfill the obligation to repay the Asset Revitalization Reserve for funding that was borrowed to complete the new #4 Fire Hall project.

CONCLUSION

In order to finalize the fulfilment of the obligation for the loan from the Asset Revitalization Reserve a transfer must be made from the Land Development Reserve to the Asset Revitalization Reserve.

BACKGROUND

In the 2010 budget, a request for funding of \$1,335,000 was approved to complete the construction of the new #4 Fire Hall of which \$335,000 was approved from the Asset Revitalization Reserve. There was an agreement or understanding that the funding from the Asset Revitalization Reserve be repaid through any one or a combination of government rebates, cost savings and or proceeds from the sale of the old #4 Fire Hall. It was estimated at that time that the proceeds of the sale of the old #4 Fire Hall could generate \$225,000 in revenue. In October 2011, the old #4 Fire Hall was sold for \$210,205.68. The net proceeds from the sale after deducting real estate, legal fees, and taxes are \$194,698.41 which is available to transfer to the Asset Revitalization Reserve to repay the outstanding obligation. The balance of the obligation, \$140,301.59 was repaid at year end by transferring unused capital funds resulting from cost savings on the construction of the new #4 Fire Hall.

At year end, pursuant to *The Regina Administration Bylaw 2003-69 Schedule A Section 33(a)*, the net proceeds from the sale of \$194,698.41 were transferred to the Land Development Reserve. In order to transfer the proceeds from the Land Development Reserve to the Asset Revitalization Reserve City Council approval is required.

DISCUSSION

There was a commitment to repay the funding utilized from the Asset Revitalization Reserve in the amount of \$335,000 for the construction of the new #4 Fire Hall. Funding in the amount of \$140,301.59 has already been repaid at year end by transferring unused capital funds resulting from cost savings on the construction of the new #4 Fire Hall. In order to fulfill the remainder of the commitment the proceeds from the sale of the old #4 Fire Hall are required to be transferred. The old #4 Fire Hall was sold in October of 2011 for \$210,205.68 resulting in net proceeds of \$194,698.41 after deducting applicable fees. This transfer would complete the repayment to the Asset Revitalization Reserve.

Another option that was pursued to repay the Asset Revitalization Reserve was the potential to receive Provincial and Federal rebates for the implementation of a wind turbine and solar hot

water heating system at the new #4 Fire Hall. The wind turbine was not deemed a cost effective electrical solution for the new fire hall and was therefore not implemented. The solar hot water heating system was implemented but it was not eligible for a rebate due to the rebate program deadline. The system was not able to be commissioned by the deadline so the system did not qualify for the rebate funding.

As a result, the best option for repaying the reserve back is utilizing the proceeds from the sale of the old #4 Fire Hall.

RECOMMENDATION IMPLICATIONS

Financial Implications

By transferring the sale proceeds, in the amount of \$194,698.41, from the Land Development Reserve to the Asset Revitalization Reserve, the reserve balances are projected to be \$8,169,134 and \$4,899,600 respectively.

Re: Grey Cup Legacy Project - Facilities Management Services Resources

RECOMMENDATION

That the six-month term position of Facilities Operations Coordinator be funded from the Facilities Reserve at a value of \$47,500.

CONCLUSION

The Grey Cup Legacy Project has reduced the need for some capital maintenance already planned for Mosaic Stadium at Taylor Field. However, the project has put pressure on the human resource capacity in the Facilities Operations branch of the Facilities Management Services department, as in addition to his regular responsibilities, the Manager has oversight responsibility for the Grey Cup Legacy Project and the 2013 Grey Cup. Transferring \$47,500 from the Facilities Reserve in 2012 to cover six months of a term Facilities Operations Coordinator position will alleviate some of that pressure and ensure that overall responsibility for Facilities Operations does not suffer because of the time required to support the Legacy Project. The transfer of funds from the Mosaic Stadium portion of the Facilities Reserve will ensure that the cost to the City of Regina is covered through funds generated at Mosaic Stadium.

BACKGROUND

The Saskatchewan Roughrider Football Club is undertaking a \$14 million Legacy Project at Mosaic Stadium at Taylor Field to prepare for the 2013 Grey Cup. The City of Regina, through the Facilities Management Services department is providing oversight to the work being undertaken by the Saskatchewan Roughriders to ensure protection of the stadium (City asset) and to ensure that the work undertaken by the Football Club does not jeopardize any of the other activities planned for the stadium. The additional workload that is a result of the oversight role is placing significant pressure on the Facilities Operations branch and will over the course of the next year and a half make it impossible to complete other important responsibilities previously outlined in the branch plan. The purpose of this report is to seek a reallocation of funding from the Facilities Reserve to fill a position on a temporary basis to provide support to the Manager of Facilities Operations and Facilities Operations branch activities.

DISCUSSION

The 101st Grey Cup will be played at Mosaic Stadium at Taylor field on Sunday, November 24, 2013. The Grey Cup is Canada's largest single sporting event of the year. The Saskatchewan Roughrider Football Club is making changes to Mosaic Stadium in anticipation of the Grey Cup. Through a staged approach seating capacity at the stadium will be increased over two years. In

time for the 2012 football season, main level stands in the north and south end zones will be constructed. The construction will include private boxes, washrooms and concessions. A second level of seating and other amenities will be added for the 2013 season.

The City of Regina has been very clear with the Saskatchewan Roughriders. The total cost of the enhancements at Mosaic Stadium over the next two years will be fully covered by the Football Club. The City of Regina has no interest in making enhancements to Mosaic Stadium while working towards the construction of a new stadium as part of the Regina Revitalization Initiative. However, the City Manager has also communicated to the Football Club the City's endorsement of the project and a commitment to provide oversight to the project work, to ensure the protection of the City of Regina asset (the stadium) and to represent the needs of other users of this community facility throughout the project.

The City is providing oversight to the project as follows: The Facilities Operations Manager is a member of the Grey Cup Legacy Project Steering Committee and provides day to day oversight. A Senior Engineer from Facilities Management Services is supporting the Facilities Operations Manager with any technical aspects of the project. The City Manager has also created an internal committee to provide high level oversight of the project. The City Manager, Deputy City Manager & CFO, Director of Facilities Management Services and Manager of Facilities Operations will meet on a regular basis with representatives of the Saskatchewan Roughriders to ensure that the project is going according to plan and that the City's interests are being considered at all stages of the project.

The Administration is confident that this approach will work well to support the Saskatchewan Roughriders in their efforts. The project however, does put additional pressure on the operational branch within the organization that has responsibility for day to day operation of all City facilities. The work required to participate with the Saskatchewan Roughriders on their project is making it impossible for the Facilities Operations Manager to complete all of his other responsibilities. On a short-term basis this would probably be manageable, however, in reality, when the responsibilities for running the stadium for the time up to and including the Grey Cup game in late November of 2013 is considered, the drain on Facilities resources is significant. To alleviate some of the pressure, it has been determined that an 18-month term position of Facilities Operations Coordinator should be added to the staffing complement for the Facilities Operations branch. The individual in this position would take over some of the day to day responsibilities of the Manager, providing him with more time to focus on the Legacy Project and the Grey Cup.

The salary costs related to this term position is approximately \$95,000 annually (including benefits). It has been determined that this position should be funded in such a manner that it does not adversely affect other program expenses within Facilities Management Services. For the six month period in 2012, the position can be funded through the Facilities Reserve. For the twelve month period covering the 2013 calendar year, the cost should be covered by the Saskatchewan Roughriders. This will be negotiated with the Roughriders at such time as an agreement is struck between the two parties that will allow the Roughriders to hold the Grey Cup at Mosaic Stadium. There is considerable time and effort required from the City's perspective to ensure that an event this large is successful. It is reasonable that through the contractual agreement for the event, the lessee of the stadium cover (in addition to other expenses the City will incur) the cost of the salary of one staff person, dedicated to providing the event.

Transferring funding from the Facilities Reserve to fund the position for six months in 2012 requires City Council approval. Within the current contractual arrangement with the Saskatchewan Roughriders, they pay annual rent for the stadium in the amount of \$200,000. The Facilities Reserve stipulates very clearly that those funds will be invested in the Reserve and are available to fund the City of Regina's portion of future upgrades to Mosaic Stadium. The Legacy Project is making some of the work already planned for the stadium unnecessary. In that regard, it makes sense to transfer the funding to the Facilities Operations salary account to allow for the hiring of some additional support for the branch, to ensure that other branch operations are not jeopardized because of the Grey Cup Legacy project. Using funding from the reserve makes sense because the funds in the reserve are specifically attributable to Mosaic Stadium as these are generated from rental fees paid by the Saskatchewan Roughriders for their use of the stadium.

RECOMMENDATION IMPLICATIONS

Financial Implications

The report outlines a recommendation to reallocate \$47,500 from the Facilities Reserve to the Facilities Operations branch to cover salary expenses for one position for six months. The reallocation moves funding previously allocated to work that is no longer necessary because of the Legacy Project. This reallocation will allow for the Legacy Project to continue with City oversight, but without adversely affecting the amount of work that could and should be completed within the Facilities Operations branch in the Facilities Management Services department.

It is appropriate to fund this position from the Mosaic Stadium portion of the Facilities Reserve as the work is directly attributable to the City's relationship with the Saskatchewan Roughriders and the funds in the reserve are generated through rental charges paid by the football club to the City. This transfer will assure that the cost to the City is covered through funds generated through rental fees for Mosaic Stadium.

Environmental Implications

None with respect to this report.

Strategic Implications

The City of Regina Administration has worked hard over the past number of years to develop planning processes throughout the organization. The Facilities Management Services department and Facilities Operations branch plans were both completed and committed to before the Legacy Project was announced. Reallocating the funding from work that is no longer required at Mosaic Stadium provides opportunity to continue to attempt to achieve the plans. Without the reallocation, plans will have to be reworked and reduced, and Facilities Management Services will achieve less than planned from a strategic perspective.

Other Implications

None with respect to this report.

Accessibility Implications

The National Building Code of Canada is very explicit with respect to accessibility requirements. Part of the oversight role undertaken by Facilities Management Services is to ensure that the construction project includes all appropriate approvals through building permits, etc.

COMMUNICATIONS

No formal communication will be undertaken with respect to this report. The City maintains relationships with the Saskatchewan Roughriders through this project and various other activities. The issue has been discussed with them. The final decision with respect to this issue will be communicated at forthcoming meetings with the Football Club.

Re: Authorization to Initiate a Process to Engage Professional Services

RECOMMENDATION

1. That the Deputy City Manager & CFO be authorized to initiate the competitive process outlined in this Report to engage professional audit services for the City of Regina and related entities for the years ending 2012 – 2016.

- 2. That the Deputy City Manager & CFO be authorized to award and finalize terms for the audit services contract, after review of proposals from professional audit firms.
- 3. The City Clerk be authorized to execute the agreement with the successful proponent as prepared by the City Solicitor.

CONCLUSION

The appointment of the current auditor expires with the completion of the 2011 audit. The auditor is appointed by City Council pursuant to Section 159 (1) of *The Cities Act*. The Administration is requesting authorization to initiate a process to engage professional audit services and to award and finalize a contract for services. The contract value is projected to exceed \$500,000.

BACKGROUND

Section 159(1) of *The Cities Act* requires that City Council appoint an auditor for the City of Regina as well as several other related entities. In 2007, the firm Deloitte & Touche LLP was appointed for a five-year term, which expired at the completion of the 2011 audit. In order to appoint an auditor for the next five-year term, the Administration is requesting authorization for the Deputy City Manager & CFO to initiate a process to engage professional audit services for the audit of the financial statements of the City of Regina and several related entities for the years ending 2012 – 2016. The contract value for the length of the contract is projected to exceed \$500,000. The Administration is also requesting that the Deputy City Manager & CFO be authorized to award and finalize terms for the audit services contract, after review of proposals from professional audit firms.

DISCUSSION

The request for proposals will be advertised through an opportunity notice posted on the City's web page and on the MERX internet tendering service. The Administration expects that a limited number of firms will reply given the specific qualifications required to plan and execute an audit of this scope and specifications.

A review committee has been established which will include the following:

Lorrie Schmalenberg, CGA, Manager, Corporate Accounting Breanne Howden, CA, Senior Financial Reporting and Policy Advisor Curtis Smith, CA, Manager, Policy and Risk Management Chuck McDonald, CMA, Director of Finance Lisa M. Weisensel, CA, Manager, Finance, Regina Public Library

Each firm considered to meet the qualifications based on the criteria that will be provided in the request for proposals will provide a written proposal as well as a presentation to the committee. The Pension Board will initiate a process to engage professional audit services for the Pension Plans with the exception that the Casual Pension Plan falls within the accounting system of the City of Regina.

In reviewing the proposals, there will be a number of considerations:

Relevant experience – an auditor must have a sufficient understanding of the organization's business, accounting principles prescribed for that business and its related entities. The City of Regina is subject to the principles of the Public Sector Accounting Board which prescribes ongoing changes to these principles so an understanding of emerging issues as they relate to the City of Regina and its entities is also important. This knowledge is necessary to understand and assess potential areas of risk that should be examined as well as to reduce the effort required by City staff and management to explain the specialized policies and procedures. Evaluation criteria will include knowledge in the audit of similar size organizations, municipalities and other government organizations.

<u>Staff Resources</u> – while junior and intermediate staff will change throughout the audit engagement, we will request a commitment for a senior designated audit partner for the full five-year term, as well as information to assess whether the firm has resources available to meet our deadlines. Since the last audit proposal in 2007, our audit timelines have decreased by approximately nine weeks which is a challenging timeline.

<u>Audit Plan and Methodology</u> – the Administration will review the proposals with an expectation that key areas and risks related to the City will be addressed in the proposal. Sufficient detail will be expected to validate the proficiency of the audit firm to plan and execute the audit.

Audit Fees and Hours – the firms will provide pricing for the audit of each separate entity that is consolidated in the financial statements as well as rates for special audits such as our third party funding audits (MAER) reports. Over the five year term of the last audit, the City of Regina consolidated entity changed significantly in its audit requirements. Tangible Capital Assets project was mandated by PSAB which was a huge undertaking for all municipalities in Saskatchewan and resulted in higher audit fees. Further, the MAER reports required by third party funding partners were not known at the time of tender. The City of Regina has some known potential changes and certainly cannot predict the unknown ones but some can be reasonably assumed from the known PSAB emerging issues. The costs of these additional/special audits can be a significant part of the complete cost; therefore, the proposals will also be evaluated for an understanding of, and pricing for, potential extra audits.

All proposals are likely to include a caveat that, should the scope change during the course of the audit, the auditors will seek to negotiate additional fees. This is standard practice within the industry as the exact nature of the audit, changes to the entities and other unknowns can cause significant extra work for the audit, some of which can be requested by management if needed. Independence – Audit firms are required to comply with the standards of their professional association in maintaining independence and objectivity. The City of Regina also has a policy on auditor independence.

Regarding independence, it is worth noting that all members of the committee of evaluation are members in good standing of professional accounting bodies, with all three national bodies represented. All professional accountants swear to a code of ethics to uphold the standards of their profession. Further, given the impact of the Audit function and the direct consequences of poor results to all members of that team, there is no motivation for any member of the committee to choose a firm on any basis other the supported criteria and the best interests of the City of Regina and its entities.

RECOMMENDATION IMPLICATIONS

Financial Implications

The operating budgets for each fiscal year will include the costs for the City's portion of the audit. For 2012 this budget has been set and for 2013 it is likely to be set before the audit firm is selected, therefore there is some risk that not all costs have been budgeted for 2012.

BACKGROUND

Attached is a copy of the 2011 City of Regina Public Accounts prepared in accordance with Section 156 of *The Cities Act* and *The Cities Regulations* and in accordance with the provisions of *The Local Authority Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act* as it relates to privacy.

DISCUSSION

The Public Accounts disclose financial information for 2011 in accordance with the legislation and regulations. Where applicable, the entity responsible for the expenditure, (City Council, Board of Police Commissioners, Buffalo Pound Water Administration Board, Regina Downtown or Regina's Warehouse Business Improvement District) is disclosed. The Public Accounts include:

- 1. City Council Remuneration and Expenses Includes the remuneration for the Mayor and Councillors, and details of expenses incurred directly or on behalf of the Mayor and Councillors.
- 2. Grants Includes a breakdown of grants and subsidies provided by the City of Regina to various organizations and individuals. The report provides a further breakdown of the grant or subsidy into the following categories:
 - Operating and Capital Grants
 - Tax Abatements and Exemptions
 - Subsidized Rent
 - Transit Subsidies

In order to provide the disclosure outlined in *The Cities Regulations*, the term grants, rather than community investments, has been used in the Public Accounts document.

3. Employee Remuneration – Includes information on employee salaries over \$50,000. Salaries reported include any retroactive pay relating to prior years paid during 2011. A separate section is provided for each of the City of Regina, the Board of Police Commissioners, the Buffalo Pound Water Administration Board, and Regina Downtown. Regina's Warehouse Business Improvement District did not have any salaries in excess of the threshold amount for reporting.

4. Expenses – Includes expenses over \$50,000 with the information shown for each entity that incurred an expense in relation to a particular company, organization or individual. A separate section is provided for each of the City of Regina, the Buffalo Pound Water Administration Board, Regina Downtown and Regina's Warehouse Business Improvement District.


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

Note 2

Travel per diems are allowances paid to Councillors when they travel out of the city on City business. The per diem rate is \$100 per day.

Note 3

Travel includes all 2011 travel expenses incurred by the Mayor and Councillors, whether paid to the Mayor and/or Councillors or on their behalf. Travel expenses represent expenses, including conference registration fees, paid directly by the City of Regina.

Note 4

Each Councillor has an annual budget of \$5,000 that covers travel, travel per diems and communication expenses. Communication expenses include ward newsletters and community newsletter advertisements. In addition, the Elected Officials Travel Policy allows Councillors to carry forward any unspent amounts to future years.



Tax Abatements and Exemptions




Subsidized Rent



Further to your letter of January 4, 2012 regarding the annual funding approved for Regina Regional Opportunities Commission (RROC), please find attached our 2011 Audited Financial Statements approved by the Board of Directors of RROC on March 17, 2012. We have also attached a copy of our 2012 Annual Report.

We understand this completes our obligations in order to receive the second payment of our 2012 funding under the Community Investment Fund approval. If you require anything further please do not hesitate to let us know.

As you may have heard, the recent provincial budget eliminated the Enterprise Region Program which RROC received funding from to support our operational costs. The amount of funding lost as a result of this was approximately \$400,000 on an annual basis. This will have a significant negative impact on the operations of RROC and we are currently assessing what changes we will have to make if alternative funding cannot be secured. Once we have completed that assessment we will be providing you with an update on our situation. Given that our approved budget for the year was a deficit of over \$400,000 already, and the fact that RROC was already one of the lowest budget entities of its nature in Canada for a city of this size, this will not be an easy problem to solve. Without presuming increased financial support from the City, as one of the potential sources of replacement funding we will no doubt be having further conversations about this with you.

Thank you for the ongoing support we have enjoyed from the City of Regina.

INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

To the Chairman and Members of the Regina Regional Opportunities Commission:

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of Regina Regional Opportunities Commission, which comprise the statement of financial position at December 31, 2011, and the statements of operations, changes in net assets and cash flows for the year then ended, and a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.

Management's Responsibility for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with Canadian generally accepted accounting principles, and for such internal control as management determines is necessary to enable the preparation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Auditor's Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit. We conducted our audit in accordance with Canadian generally accepted auditing standards. 1. DESCRIPTION OF OPERATIONS

On April 27, 2009, Bylaw 2009-20 created the Regina Regional Opportunities Commission (the "Commission") from the merge of the Regina Regional Economic Development Authority ("RREDA") and Tourism Regina. The Commission began operating as an entity on July 1, 2009.

The broad mandate of the Commission is to create and implement an economic development strategy to grow and sustain prosperity in the Regina region.

2. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Canadian generally accepted accounting principles. These financial statements are included in the consolidated financial statements of the City of Regina.

The Commission's significant accounting policies are as follows:

a) Use of estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with Canadian generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect reported amounts of assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the year. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

b) Property and equipment

Property and equipment are recorded at cost. Amortization has been provided using the straight-line method over the following years:

Building	2 years
Leasehold improvement	3 years
Furniture and equipment	10 years
Flag park	2 years
Display unit	10 years
Highway turnouts	10 years
Computer hardware	5 years
Computer software	2-3 years

Amortization is charged in the year of acquisition and in the year of disposal for a half year. It is expected that these procedures will charge operations with the total cost of the assets over their useful life. Gains or losses on the disposal of individual assets are recognized in income in the year of disposal.

2. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

c) Revenue recognition

Publication revenue is recognized when publications are produced, if amounts received can be reasonably estimated and collection is reasonably assured. Publication fees received in advance of production are deferred.

The Commission follows the deferral method of accounting for contributions. Restricted contributions are recognized as revenue in the year in which the related expenses are incurred. Unrestricted contributions are recognized as revenue, if the amount to be received can be reasonably estimated and collection is reasonably assured.

d) Financial instruments

Financial assets and financial liabilities are initially recognized at fair value and their subsequent measurement is dependent on their classification as described below. Their classification depends on the purpose for which the financial instruments were acquired or issued, their characteristics and the Commission's designation of such instruments.

Held-for-trading

Held-for-trading financial assets are financial assets acquired for resale prior to maturity or that have been designated as held-for-trading. They are measured at fair value at the balance sheet date. Fair value fluctuations including interest earned, interest accrued, gains and losses realized on disposal and unrealized gains and losses are included in other income.

Loans and receivables

Loans and receivables are accounted for at amortized cost using the effective interest method.

Other liabilities

Other liabilities are recorded at amortized cost using the effective interest method and include all financial liabilities.

Transaction costs

All transaction costs are expensed as incurred.

2. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

Financial instruments

Not-for-profit organizations may elect to adopt Sections 3862, "Financial Instruments – Disclosure", and 3863, "Financial Instruments – Presentation", or to continue applying Section 3861, "Financial Instruments – Disclosure and Presentation". The Commission has elected not to adopt Sections 3862 and 3863.

3. FUTURE CHANGES IN ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The Canadian Institute of Chartered Accountants ("CICA") has issued a new accounting framework for government not-for-profit organizations. Effective for fiscal years beginning on or after January 1, 2012 government not-for-profit organizations will have to choose between Canadian public sector accounting standards with not-for-profit accounting standards or Canadian public sector accounting standards without not-for-profit accounting standards. As at year end, the Commission has not yet decided which framework to follow. The impact to the Commission's financial reporting will be dependent on which accounting framework is adopted.

7. FINANCIAL INSTRUMENTS

Interest rate risk

The Commission is exposed to interest rate risk associated with the amount of interest being earned on its investments.

Credit risk

The Commission is exposed to credit risk from potential non-payment of accounts receivable and short-term investments. The Commission's receivables are primarily from major funding agencies whose credit risk is considered to be low. Short-term investments are with major Canadian financial institutions whose credit risk is considered to be low.

Fair values

The fair value of cash, accounts receivable, accounts payable and short-term investments approximates carrying value due to the short-term maturity of these items.

8. CAPITAL MANAGEMENT

The Commission relies primarily on grants from the City of Regina, Province of Saskatchewan and Enterprise Saskatchewan. The Commission uses these funds available to promote any economic initiative that will assist in the creation of tourism and investment opportunities and employment by sustaining existing business and also by encouraging new companies to become resident in the Regina region.

The Commission has adopted a conservative investment policy which maintains liquidity in high quality, low risk short term marketable securities.





PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE



I am pleased to report on our initiatives and achievements during another very successful year. We have had strong positive results in two of the key areas of our responsibility to the City of Regina:

- As a manager and provider of events and event services at Evraz Place
- As stewards of the land and buildings known as Evraz Place

In 2011 Evraz Place achieved a record \$30 million in gross revenues, nearly triple the gross revenues recorded eight years ago. Bottom line income for 2011 was \$791,000, the second highest net income achieved in the prior eight years. Our financial health measured in terms of strong working capital, low debt load and the fact that we have recorded six consecutive years of profitability remains strong. As well in the past eight years we have re-invested over \$10.8 million of cash generated by the business into the property at Evraz Place.

Our event business remains strong. We hosted the 2011 Ford Men's World Curling Championships in the newly air conditioned and dehumidified Brandt Centre. Some traditional offerings such as Regina Pats hockey, the Queen City Ex and Canadian Western Agribition have shown some improved results in terms of attendance levels or sales. The Western Canada Farm Progress Show was named 2011 Tourism Event of the Year by Saskatchewan Tourism. The "Farm Show" is experiencing strong growth in attendance by international buyers and was named the "Largest Trade Show in Canada" by Trade Show News Network magazine. With our partners in the community such as the Regina Regional Opportunities Corporation, the Regina Hotels Association, SaskMusic and the Saskatchewan Roughrider Football Club, we were able to announce the 2013 Juno Awards coming to the Brandt Centre in April and the Grey Cup Festival in November.

We are also very pleased with the growth of our sport and recreation business, which is performing well above our initial projections. You will also see that the food and beverage division continues to perform well, ensuring our property is busy and that our guests leave happy and well fed.

STEWARDSHIP OF EVRAZ PLACE

In recent years, we have made the improved stewardship of the property at Evraz Place a top priority. With over \$80M in capital reinvestment in new and refurbished facilities (Credit Union EventPlex, Co-operators Centre, Brandt Centre, Queensbury Convention Centre

and kitchen/commissary), we need to take the necessary steps to maintain these assets to a high standard. In 2011, we recorded a record \$2M in reinvestment in capital improvements, repairs and maintenance.

Two years ago, we also embarked upon a computerized Plant Operations and

Maintenance Program (POM). We have now catalogued most of our equipment – everything from boilers, compressors to heating, ventilation to air conditioning equipment. Our POM Division now

utilizes our computerized program to keep on top of preventative maintenance work, following manufacturers recommended maintenance standards. This program not only helps us organize our work, it helps management to track results and problem areas. This program is central to our goal of long term sustainability of the assets at Evraz Place.

Finally, thanks to the Board for their hard work and leadership, and to the managers and staff that make it all happen here day after day. We are fortunate to enjoy nice growth in our business, while generating a profit and making significant reinvestments in the facilities.

They laid the foundation on which we stand today and directed the organization through many decades of growth and change. It is a new day and a new dawn in Saskatchewan. Growth and prosperity allow for opportunity and we have to position our company to continue to grow.

Last year we talked about the significant investments we have made in the assets of the Company that will benefit generations to come. This move and modernization of our governance and the capital and opportunity that this new structure affords is the most significant non cash investment in our future we could make. It is the right decision. It is a brave decision. It is a decision we are proud to be part of.

COMMUNITY IMPACT

PROFILE

Situated in the heart of the Queen city — Regina, Evraz Place is one of the largest and most influential event complexes in the country. It is a centre of excellence for entertainment, agri-business, sporting, recreational and cultural activities. Evraz Place boasts 1.2 million square feet of indoor space and close to 42 acres of usable outdoor tradeshow space. The organization produces and hosts the majority of Regina's major events every year, including Western Canada Farm Progress Show presented by Viterra, the provincial exhibition — Queen City Ex Presented by Mosaic and Prairie Mobile Taste of Spring. It is home to the Canadian Western Agribition, the WHL's Regina Pats, Regina Soccer Association, Spring Home & Garden Show & Sale, First Nations University of Canada Pow Wow and numerous concerts, tradeshows and conventions.

The Co-operators Centre and Credit Union EventPlex host over 40 tournaments and special events annually, bringing in people from across Saskatchewan and Western Canada. With the largest integrated ice and turf sport complex in Canada, scheduling events like the Skate Canada Challenge fills over 1,000 hotel rooms on its own.

ECONOMIC IMPACT

Evraz Place is an economic engine that generates a \$75 million impact annually on Regina and the surrounding areas' economy. It supports over 3,100 jobs in the province, creating \$50 million in labor income. The event site impacts on a broad range of people with more than 70 percent of them coming from outside an 80km radius. It was estimated that more than 2.5 million people pass through the gates of Evraz Place annually, attending over 1,000 events. These events and activities also provide opportunities for local, regional and national media exposure.

EMPLOYMENT

Evraz Place operates on an annual budget of \$27 million and employs approximately 170 full-time and more than 600 part-time and casual staff. Recognizing this ongoing success would not be possible without the support of its dedicated employees; Evraz Place is committed to ongoing staff training, appreciation and professional development. Various staff appreciation events are held throughout the year. The organization also offers the Employee Family Assistance Program (EFAP) which provides counseling and assistance to Evraz Place employees and their families.

CORPORATE ROLE

Evraz Place gives back to the community that it serves. The organization employs many at-risk youth who come from backgrounds involving poverty, unemployment, violence, alcohol and/or substance abuse. In fact, Evraz Place is one of the largest employers of North Central residents in Regina.

To serve the organization's corporate social responsibility, Evraz Place staff is taking a part in supporting the city Police and Fire departments, Wascana Community School, and the North Central Family Centre. From December 1990 to 2008, Evraz Place and its employees were also Partners in Education with Wascana /Herchmer Community School. In addition to the community support on a local level, Evraz Place is active at both the civic and provincials levels. The President and CEO sit on the Mayor's community Leaders Advisory Council.

TOURISM

Evraz Place is an important anchor within the tourism industry – provincially, nationally and internationally. It is one of the top tourist attractions in the province and brings in hundreds of thousands of visitors every year.

In recognition of the numerous spin-offs created by the tourism industry, management and staff at Evraz Place are committed to fostering and maintaining partnership that work to strengthen tourism network. Members of the management team sit on the Board of Directors of Regina Regional Opportunities Commission (RROC) and various tourism committees. Evraz Place is also an active member of RROC, participating in many of their marketing programs and also involved with other tourism organizations such as the Regina Airport Authority, Tourism Saskatchewan, Special Events Regina (SER) and the Saskatchewan Trade & Export Partnership (STEP). Management members have been key participants in major event bids, and organizing committees, which have been successful in attracting events like the 2006 Tim Horton's Brier, 2007 Canadian Country Music Awards, 2008 Scotties Tournament of Hearts and the 2010 World Junior Hockey Champions.



Evraz Place, the hottest entertainment hub of the province brought a diversity of high-profiled artists and excellent performances in 2011, which attracted nearly 135,000 attendees and generated over \$7.7 million in ticket sales.


International singer/songwriter and performer Elton John with his band did not disappoint their audience, performing their "Greatest Hits Live" concert on May 11th & 12th. Pop Super Star, Katy Perry made her way through Regina on July 13th with her "California Dreams" tour. Her electric performance at the Brandt Centre gave her sold out audience a night to remember.

Brandt Centre, the 6000-seat facility has been hosting all home games of the WHL's Regina Pats for the past 35 years. Evraz Place is proud to have Pats fans recognize the Brandt Centre as the home of this beloved hockey team.

The organization acknowledges the importance of agriculture and continues to support the agri-business in our province and throughout Canada. Evraz Place is proud to be the home of the Canadian Western Agribition – one of the main agricultural events in the country.

In 2011, Evraz Place was home for a variety of entertainment and events including; Nelly, Ford's World Men's Curling, Keith Urban, Avril Lavigne, Disney Live Show, Buck Cherry & Papa Roach, Godsmack, LMFAO, Toby Keith, Seinfeld, WWE and the Harlem Globe Trotters. Each show left their audience with a unique experience.

The Ford Men's World Curling Championship was the most successful national or international curling event held in North America during the 2011/12 Season. During the final weekend the Brandt Centre was filled to capacity with people from around the world, who enjoyed warm hospitality, cool refreshments and top notch curling. Overall attendance topped 110,000. Regina showed their pride and cheered Team Canada — Jeff Stoughton team from Winnipeg on to victory. Evraz Place was noted as one of the best venues in the world for hosting curling events — the connectivity is second to none.



FARM SHOW:

Western Canada Farm Progress Show presented by Viterra embraced an unprecedented success in 2011 with an increased number of exhibitors and products; expanded tradeshow space; and a record-breaking crowd.

At this year's Farm Progress Show (June 20-22), an Innovations Program was introduced to promote all new inventions or improvements/enhancements made to existing products. This Innovations Program included a competition. Each product that qualified a new innovation was automatically qualified to be judged by a panel of six industry experts. The winners were awarded a gold or sterling Innovation Award.

To accommodate the growing appetite of exhibitors, the Farm Progress Show increased their tradeshow display area form 1.6 million sq. ft. to 1.78 million sq. ft. The 2010 opening of the Co-operators Centre is the essential contributor to the exhibit space increase. All tradeshow booths were completely sold out.


Western Canada Farm Progress Show is the country's largest dryland farming exposition and is consistently ranked number one among farm shows for its relevance to exhibitors and the agriculture industry.

QUEEN CITY EX

Excitement was in the air again this year for the 2011 Queen City Ex presented by Mosaic. The five-day provincial exhibition drew a crowd of 206,409 visitors. These numbers are just shy of 2010's attendance which was the highest in 10 years.

Downtown attractions such as the Strawberry Social on Scarth Street and the Pancake Breakfast at City Hall were also well attended and received.

The Mosaic Flip for Hunger (Pancake Breakfast) on Sunday, August 7th was tremendous success. Over 6,100



lbs of non perishable items and over \$1,000 were collected by Mosaic for the Regina Food Bank at the breakfast. Mosaic also donated 1,000 admission & 200 ride passes to underprivileged youth and charitable groups as part of the Experience The Ex Program.

The Molson Canadian Grandstand which featured the acts of Marianas Trench, April Wine, Dierks Bentley, Great White and Down with Webster, all attracting great crowds. Other attractions and thrill acts included Chinese Acrobats of Hebei, Boogeyman Brigade Motocross, Stampede Wresting, KAOS Dog sports, Tanzania Mania, HOJA and Wayne Lee.

North American Midway enjoyed their best year yet in 2011.

TASTE OF SPRING


Prairie Mobile Taste of Spring – Regina's celebration of fine wines, spirits and food, was once again was the most anticipated event in the city. The 2011 show drew a crowd of more than 7,500 over the three night event. Friday and Saturday nights were sold out in a matter of minutes.

Due to a rising interest, this premier event out-grew the space at the Queensbury Convention Centre and moved into the Credit Union EventPlex in 2010. Exhibitors and guests are now enjoying, the more spacious venue.









Recreation

Year two of operation for the Sport & Recreation Division provided Regina and the surrounding communities with more than 12,000 hours of ice time and 10,000 hours of indoor turf programming. In addition, over 1 million people visited the Credit Union EventPlex and Co-operators Centre during regular programming and the over 40 tournaments & special events in 2011.

New for 2011, the Co-operators Centre Hockey League welcomed more than 100 adult recreational hockey teams (over 1,600 participants) to the facility. In 2012 the Co-operators Centre will also serve as a home facility to the highly successful youth 3 on 3 league and spring/summer adult league previously operated by Canlan Ice Sports.

SPORT EVENTS

The flexibility of the Sports & Recreation facilities allowed for a variety of community sport uses including hockey, soccer, flag football, broomball, figure skating, ringette, lacrosse, ball hockey and inline hockey. Evraz Place was also proud to partner with Casino Regina in 2011 to offer free daytime public skating for citizens of Regina.


One of the highlights of 2011 was hosting the Skate Canada Challenge at the Co-operators Centre from November 30th to December 4th. This was the first Skate Canada event hosted in Regina since 1987. Over 500 participants along with coaches, parents and officials from across Canada descended upon Regina for the event. The best of Canada's future Olympic and World Championship contenders displayed their talents to an appreciative crowd. Fast becoming one of the city's largest sporting events, the World Class Players Cup took over the Credit Union EventPlex for 19 days in April. This sporting and multi-cultural event has grown to 41 teams with over 1,200 participants and 20,000 spectators along with over 100 volunteers. In only six years, this event produced by local soccer icon Kevin Holness has become a staple of the local sporting scene.

Looking ahead, Evraz Place is pleased to welcome back the Canadian National Gymnastics Championships in May of 2012. Evraz Place first hosted this event in 2007 in the Credit Union EventPlex. In 2012, the event will utilize two arenas of the Co-operators Centre and the Credit Union Eventplex providing Canada's elite gymnasts and Olympic contenders with an additional 40,000 sq. ft. of training space and over 90,000 sq. ft. of competition area.

In addition to sport and recreational activities, the multipurpose facilities were used as exhibit and activity space for the City's major annual community events, such as the Western Canada Farm Progress Show, Queen City Ex presented by Mosaic, Canadian Western Agribition and Prairie Mobile Taste of Spring.





Management maintains systems of internal accounting control designed to provide reasonable assurance that all transactions are properly recorded in the Association's book of accounts, that procedures and policies are adhered to and that assets are safeguarded from unauthorized use.

Virtus Group LLP, an independent firm of Chartered Accountants, has been engaged as approved by the shareholders' vote at the 2011 Annual General Meeting to examine the financial statements in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards and provide an independent professional opinion.

The Audit and Finance Committee is composed of six members of the Board of Directors and meets regularly with the officers of the Association. The external auditors of the Association have access to the Audit and Finance Committee with or without management being present. The Audit and Finance Committee meets with the external auditors to review the planning and scope of testing and to discuss the results of their audit work. The external auditors issue a management letter. The financial statements have been approved by the Board of Directors on the recommendation of the Audit and Finance Committee.

Notes to the Financial Statements

For the Year Ended December 31, 2011

1. Description of the business

The Regina Exhibition Association Limited (the Association) is a not-for-profit organization incorporated under a private act of the Province of Saskatchewan. Under its bylaws dividends cannot be paid and its shares cannot appreciate in value. The Association operates Evraz Place and leases land owned by the City of Regina under a nominal cost lease expiring in 2012. The Association expects to enter into a continued long-term lease arrangement with the City of Regina in 2012.

2. Accounting policies

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles which require management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amount of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amount of revenue and expenses during the year. These estimates are reviewed periodically and adjustments as necessary are reported in the period of review.

a) Property & equipment and amortization

Property and equipment are recorded at cost. Amortization is recorded over the estimated useful life of the assets as follows:

Buildings Equipment -straight-line over 10 to 30 years -straight-line over 3 to 20 years

b) Revenue recognition

Sales revenue, including catering, concessions and events, and Rental revenue are recognized as services are provided. Sponsorship and advertising revenue is recognized based on the terms of the contract.

c) Grants and other contributions

Grants and other contributions received by the Association are accounted for as follows:

- i) Grants and other contributions to assist with the financing of capital asset additions are recorded as deferred capital contributions (see note 5). The portion of the grant and other contributions equivalent to the annual amortization expense of the related asset is recognized annually as Contributions and other income.
- Grants and other contributions intended for grounds and buildings repairs and maintenance are recorded in revenue in the period in which they are received.
- Grants and other contributions not specifically intended for capital asset additions are recorded in revenue in the period the related expenses are incurred.
- d) Financial instruments Recognition and measurement

All financial instruments are designated and classified as one of the following: held-to-maturity, loans and receivables, held-for-trading or available-for-sale and other liabilities.

Financial assets and liabilities held-for-trading are measured at fair value with gains and losses recognized in net income. Financial assets held-to-maturity, loans and receivables and financial liabilities other than those held-for-trading are measured at amortized cost. Available for sale financial assets are measured at fair value with unrealized gains and losses recognized as a separate component of net assets. Upon initial recognition any financial instrument may be designated as held-for-trading.

The capital of the Association consists of its net assets and long-term debt. The Association budgets annually for sufficient capital to meet operating needs. The Association is not subject to significant capital restrictions.

7. Financial instruments

The carrying amounts reported in the financial statements for accounts and grants receivable, and accounts payable and accrued liabilities approximate fair values due to the immediate or short-term maturities of these financial instruments.

The fair value of long-term debt, including current portion of long-term debt, is approximately \$1,235,000 based on current market interest rates.

In management's estimation the Association is not subject to significant concentration of credit risk.

8. Revenue continuance

On November 22 1997, the Association ceased operating its casino. In accordance with an agreement between the Association and the Province of Saskatchewan, a 30 year agreement was entered into whereby the Association will receive \$2,600,000 annually to maintain its earnings.

In a subsequent agreement with Canadian Western Agribition (CWA), the Association agreed to annual payments of \$50,000 to CWA in recognition of historical revenue sharing.

9. Contingencies

The Association is subject to certain legal matters arising in the normal course of business, none of which are expected to materially affect the financial results of the Association.

10. Related parties

In the normal course of operations, the Association has relationships with Directors' businesses. These transactions are conducted at market prices and at comparable terms as with unrelated parties. The Association requires Directors' to adhere to its Conflict of Interest policy.
