BACKGROUND

The Community Investment Grants Program 2014 included funding for three streams: Culture, Social Development, Sport & Recreation. Each funding stream has its own priorities.

Within the Culture stream there are three grant types: Community Partner (core operating and programming), Annual Activities and New Initiatives.

The level of funding recommended for each stream is based on an assessment of funds allocated to aligned organizations/initiatives in 2013 through the previous Community Investment program.

Administration will deliver a presentation summarizing the number of cultural organizations supported through 2014 and the inputs used to evolve the program to meet community needs in 2015.



Two special envelopes of funding:

New Initiatives - eligible initiatives, one time or first time;

- organizational development, capacity-building and long-term planning
- capital initiative projects
- program/project grants

Annual Activity - eligible activities, recurring or ongoing;

- annual festivals
- annual events
- seasonal presentations
- series, outreach or education
- exhibition cycles
- operation and management of a cultural space
