RECOMMENDATION

CONCLUSION

The crime statistics for the month of May 2013 reflect a decrease in Crimes Against the Person of (-11.8%) compared to May 2012, while Crimes Against Property show a (-19.6%) decrease compared to May 2012. Crimes Against the Person and Crimes Against Property show a combined year-to-date reduction of (-17.9%).

BACKGROUND

Each month, reports providing statistics for the City of Regina are provided to the Crime Prevention Advisory Committee for their review and information. This report will provide statistics for the month of May 2013.

DISCUSSION

Crimes Against Property reflect a decrease of (-815) reported incidents over 2012, for an overall year-to-date decrease of (-19.6%). We have seen a decrease of (-312) reported incidents of Theft Under \$5000 for a (-17.3%) decrease. There are (-162) fewer reported incidents of Mischief / Wilful Damage for a (-16.2%) decrease.

Thefts of Auto rates have decreased by (-132) incidents for an overall decrease of (-33.6%) in our year-to-date statistics. The Regina Police Service in conjunction with its partners in the Stolen Auto Strategy continues to pay constant attention to this issue.

Crimes Against the Person reflect a year-to-date decrease of (-132) fewer incidents over May 2013 for an (-11.8%) decrease. There were 17 reported Robberies in May for a year-to-date decrease of (-16) incidents or a decrease of (-18.2%).

Overall the Regina Police Service has received (-947) fewer reported incidents of Crimes Against the Person and Crimes Against Property combined in 2013 over 2012 incidents for a (-17.9%) decrease.

There were a total of 5819 dispatched Calls for Service in May for a year-to-date reduction of (-1.3%) and Alarm Calls for Service show a year-to-date decrease of (-0.4%).

CONCLUSION

The crime statistics for the month of June 2013 reflect a decrease in Crimes Against the Person of (-12.1%) compared to June 2012, while Crimes Against Property show a (-15.7%) decrease compared to June 2012. Crimes Against the Person and Crimes Against Property show a combined year-to-date reduction of (-14.9%).

BACKGROUND

Each month, reports providing statistics for the City of Regina are provided to the Crime Prevention Advisory Committee for their review and information. This report will provide statistics for the month of June 2013.

DISCUSSION

Crimes Against Property reflect a decrease of (-837) reported incidents over 2012, for an overall year-to-date decrease of (-15.7%). We have seen a decrease of (-363) reported incidents of Theft Under \$5000 for a (-15.5%) decrease. There are (-181) fewer reported incidents of Mischief / Wilful Damage for a (-13.9%) decrease.

Thefts of Auto rates have decreased by (-142) incidents for an overall decrease of (-28.1%) in our year-to-date statistics. The Regina Police Service in conjunction with its partners in the Stolen Auto Strategy continues to pay constant attention to this issue.

Crimes Against the Person reflect a year-to-date decrease of (-171) fewer incidents over June 2013 for a (-12.1%) decrease. There were 29 reported Robberies in June for a year-to-date decrease of (-24) incidents or a decrease of (-19.4%).

Overall the Regina Police Service has received (-1008) fewer reported incidents of Crimes Against the Person and Crimes Against Property combined in 2013 over 2012 incidents for a (-14.9%) decrease.

There were a total of 6352 dispatched Calls for Service in June for a year-to-date reduction of (-0.3%) and Alarm Calls for Service show a year-to-date decrease of (-3.3%).

CONCLUSION

The crime statistics for the month of July2013 reflect a decrease in Crimes Against the Person of (-10.0%) compared to July 2012, while Crimes Against Property show an (-11.5%) decrease compared to July 2012. Crimes Against the Person and Crimes Against Property show a combined year-to-date reduction of (-11.2%).

BACKGROUND

Each month, reports providing statistics for the City of Regina are provided to the Crime Prevention Advisory Committee for their review and information. This report will provide statistics for the month of July 2013.

DISCUSSION

Crimes Against Property reflect a decrease of (-751) reported incidents over 2012, for an overall year-to-date decrease of (-11.5%). We have seen a decrease of (-327) reported incidents of Theft Under \$5000 for an (-11.6%) decrease. There are (-197) fewer reported incidents of Mischief / Wilful Damage for a (-12.5%) decrease.

Thefts of Auto rates have decreased by (-165) incidents for an overall decrease of (-25.9%) in our year-to-date statistics. The Regina Police Service in conjunction with its partners in the Stolen Auto Strategy continues to pay constant attention to this issue.

Crimes Against the Person reflect a year-to-date decrease of (-169) fewer incidents over July 2013 for a (-10%) decrease. There were 22 reported Robberies in July for a year-to-date decrease of (-22) incidents or a decrease of (-14.6%).

Overall the Regina Police Service has received (-920) fewer reported incidents of Crimes Against the Person and Crimes Against Property combined in 2013 over 2012 incidents for an (-11.2%) decrease.

There were a total of 6136 dispatched Calls for Service in July for a year-to-date reduction of (-0.6%) and Alarm Calls for Service show a year-to-date decrease of (-1.8%).

The crime statistics for the month of August 2013 reflect a decrease in Crimes Against the Person of (-9.1%) compared to August 2012, while Crimes Against Property show a (-9.1%) decrease compared to August 2012. Crimes Against the Person and Crimes Against Property show a combined year-to-date reduction of (-9.1%).

BACKGROUND

Each month, reports providing statistics for the City of Regina are provided to the Crime Prevention Advisory Committee for their review and information. This report will provide statistics for the month of August 2013.

DISCUSSION

Crimes Against Property reflect a decrease of (-683) reported incidents over 2012, for an overall year-to-date decrease of (-9.1%). We have seen a decrease of (-292) reported incidents of Theft Under \$5000 for a (-9.0%) decrease. There are (-189) fewer reported incidents of Mischief / Wilful Damage for a (-10.4%) decrease.

Thefts of Auto rates have decreased by (-173) incidents for an overall decrease of (-23.2%) in our year-to-date statistics. The Regina Police Service in conjunction with its partners in the Stolen Auto Strategy continues to pay constant attention to this issue.

Crimes Against the Person reflect a year-to-date decrease of (-179) fewer incidents over August 2013 for a (-9.1%) decrease. There were 35 reported Robberies in August for a year-to-date decrease of (-15) incidents or a decrease of (-8.1%).

Overall the Regina Police Service has received (-862) fewer reported incidents of Crimes Against the Person and Crimes Against Property combined in 2013 over 2012 incidents for a (-9.1%) decrease.

There were a total of 6238 dispatched Calls for Service in August for a year-to-date reduction of (-0.3%) and Alarm Calls for Service show a year-to-date decrease of (-2.0%).

CONCLUSION

The crime statistics for the month of October 2013 reflect a decrease in Crimes Against the Person of (-10.6%) compared to October 2012, while Crimes Against Property show a (-6.9%) decrease compared to October 2012. Crimes Against the Person and Crimes Against Property show a combined year-to-date reduction of (-7.7%).

BACKGROUND

Each month, reports providing statistics for the City of Regina are provided to the Crime Prevention Advisory Committee for their review and information. This report will provide statistics for the month of October 2013.

DISCUSSION

Crimes Against Property reflect a decrease of (-639) reported incidents over 2012, for an overall year-to-date decrease of (-6.9%). We have seen a decrease of (-253) reported incidents of Theft Under \$5000 for a (-6.3%) decrease. There are (-162) fewer reported incidents of Mischief / Wilful Damage for a (-7.1%) decrease.

Thefts of Auto rates have decreased by (-176) incidents for an overall decrease of (-20.0%) in our year-to-date statistics. The Regina Police Service in conjunction with its partners in the Stolen Auto Strategy continues to pay constant attention to this issue.

Crimes Against the Person reflect a year-to-date decrease of (-258) fewer incidents over October 2013 for an (-10.6%) decrease. There were 19 reported Robberies in October for a year-to-date decrease of (-27) incidents or a decrease of (-11.4%).

Overall the Regina Police Service has received (-897) fewer reported incidents of Crimes Against the Person and Crimes Against Property combined in 2013 over 2012 incidents for a (-7.7%) decrease.

Dispatched Calls for Service and Alarm Calls for Service are unavailable for the month of October and will be included in the November Crime Stats Report.

CONCLUSION

The crime statistics for the month of November 2013 reflect a decrease in Crimes Against the Person of (-8.0%) compared to November 2012, while Crimes Against Property show a (-2.9%) decrease compared to November 2012. Crimes Against the Person and Crimes Against Property show a combined year-to-date reduction of (-2.9%).

BACKGROUND

Each month, reports providing statistics for the City of Regina are provided to the Crime Prevention Advisory Committee for their review and information. This report will provide statistics for the month of November 2013.

DISCUSSION

Crimes Against Property reflect a decrease of (-148) reported incidents over 2012, for an overall year-to-date decrease of (-1.5%). We have seen a decrease of (-39) reported incidents of Theft Under \$5000 for a (-0.9%) decrease. There are (-56) fewer reported incidents of Mischief / Wilful Damage for a (-2.3%) decrease.

Thefts of Auto rates have decreased by (-146) incidents for an overall decrease of (-16%) in our year-to-date statistics. The Regina Police Service in conjunction with its partners in the Stolen Auto Strategy continues to pay constant attention to this issue.

Crimes Against the Person reflect a year-to-date decrease of (-210) fewer incidents over November 2013 for an (-8.0%) decrease. There were 15 reported Robberies in November for a year-to-date decrease of (-27) incidents or a decrease of (-10.7%).

Overall the Regina Police Service has received (-358) fewer reported incidents of Crimes Against the Person and Crimes Against Property combined in 2013 over 2012 incidents for a (-2.9%) decrease.

There were a total of 4562 dispatched Calls for Service in November for a year-to-date reduction of (-1.2%) and Alarm Calls for Service show a year-to-date decrease of (-3.5%).

CONCLUSION

The crime statistics for the month of December 2013 reflect a decrease in Crimes Against the Person of (-9.4%) compared to December 2012, while Crimes Against Property show a (-0.9%) decrease compared to December 2012. Crimes Against the Person and Crimes Against Property show a combined year-to-date reduction of (-2.7%).

BACKGROUND

Each month, reports providing statistics for the City of Regina are provided to the Crime Prevention Advisory Committee for their review and information. This report will provide statistics for the month of December 2013.

DISCUSSION

Crimes Against Property reflect a decrease of (-89) reported incidents over 2012, for an overall year-to-date decrease of (-0.9%). We have seen a decrease of (-53) reported incidents of Theft Under \$5000 for a (-1.2%) decrease. There are (-40) fewer reported incidents of Mischief / Wilful Damage for a (-1.6%) decrease.

Thefts of Auto rates have decreased by (-171) incidents for an overall decrease of (-17%) in our year-to-date statistics. The Regina Police Service in conjunction with its partners in the Stolen Auto Strategy continues to pay constant attention to this issue.

Crimes Against the Person reflect a year-to-date decrease of (-265) fewer incidents over December 2013 for a (-9.4%) decrease. There were 7 reported Robberies in December for a year-to-date decrease of (-32) incidents or a decrease of (-12.1%).

Overall the Regina Police Service has received (-354) fewer reported incidents of Crimes Against the Person and Crimes Against Property combined in 2013 over 2012 incidents for a (-2.7%) decrease.

There were a total of 4,185 dispatched Calls for Service in December for a year-to-date reduction of (-1.7%) and Alarm Calls for Service show a year-to-date decrease of (-2.7%). Report Impaired Drivers (RID) statistics are unavailable this month as a result of a systems upgrade in October of 2013. Compilation of the 2013 Year-end RID statistics are not completed as of this date and will be provided at the March, 2014, Board of Police Commissioners meeting.
