RECOMMENDATION

1. That the Board of Police Commissioners offer a reward of \$25,000.00 for information leading to the arrest and conviction of the person(s) responsible for the death of Adisalam Dahir Nur.

2. That the reward expire December 31, 2018.

CONCLUSION

The Regina Police Service is investigating a homicide which occurred on August 5, 2016. The investigation will continue until all investigative avenues have been exhausted.

BACKGROUND

Abdisalam Dahir Nur was involved in a violent drug network. On August 5, 2016, the body of Abdisalam Dahir Nur was discovered at the address of 2065 McDonald Street. The victim was also known by the names "Dame" or "Damien". Abdisalam Nur was of Somalia descent living in Edmonton, Alberta, at the time of his death. He was in Regina only a short period of time before he was murdered at 2065 McDonald Street.

Witnesses at the time of the murder described seeing two males flee from the rear of 2065 McDonald Street and drive away in what was described as a red Jeep or SUV, possibly with an Alberta license plate.

DISCUSSION

The Regina Police Service continues to hold the murder of Abdisalam Dahir Nur as a priority. The investigation has been ongoing since August 5, 2016. Two members of the Major Crime Unit are actively investigating the murder of Abdisalam Dahir Nur.

Persons of interest have been identified and all leads are followed up on as they are received by police; however, several investigative avenues have been exhausted. The investigators believe there are individuals who know who was involved and what actually took place at 2065 McDonald Street prior to Abdisalam Dahir Nur being murdered there. Investigators believe a reward may stimulate someone to come forward with the crucial information necessary to bring this investigation to a successful conclusion.

RECOMMENDATION IMPLICATIONS

Financial Implications

The Regina Police Service will not specifically set aside \$25,000 in the 2018 budget to cover the expense of a claimed reward. If a reward is claimed, the Regina Police Service will make every effort to manage the expenditure within the 2018 budget.

Environmental Implications

Strategic Implications

The reward may elicit information to identify those responsible for the death of Adisalam Dahir Nur.

Reward Guidelines:

- If you have information regarding this investigation, contact the Regina Police Service, Major Crimes Unit.
- In order to qualify for the reward, the Regina Police Service requires persons to provide their name and address and a complete statement of their knowledge of the case to investigators. They may be required to testify. No confidentiality can be offered.
- In the event of an arrest, you may choose to file a claim for the reward. If you do so, you must file a claim by letter addressed to the Chief of Police, 1717 Osler Street, Regina, Saskatchewan, S4P 3W3. You may choose to mail it via regular mail or courier. Please ensure you keep a dated copy of your claim letter and any receipts.
- Upon completion of the case in court where a conviction occurs, the Regina Police Service Board of Police Commissioners and the Chief of Police at their sole discretion will determine the portion of the reward to be paid to any claimant(s). Only persons who have filed a claim to the reward will be considered.

The continued \$25,000 reward will be communicated on the Regina Police Service website and through other media sources.

RECOMMENDATION

CONCLUSION

The crime statistics for the month of September 2017 reflect a decrease in Crimes Against the Person of [-6.7%] compared to September 2016, while Crimes Against Property show a [-2.5%] decrease compared to September 2016. Crimes Against the Person and Crimes Against Property show a combined year-to-date decrease of [-3.2%].

BACKGROUND

Each month, reports providing statistics for the City of Regina are presented to the Board for their review and information. This report will provide statistics for the month of September 2017. The Communications Centre statistics are included showing the total calls for service.

DISCUSSION

Crimes Against Property reflect a decrease of [-242] reported incidents over 2016, for an overall year-to-date decrease of [-2.5%]. We have seen an increase of 238 reported incidents of Theft Under \$5,000 for a 5.8% increase. There are [-210] less reported incidents of Mischief / Wilful Damage for a [-9.7%] decrease.

Thefts of Auto rates have decreased by [-84] incidents for an overall decrease of [-10.1%] in our year-to-date statistics. The Regina Police Service in conjunction with its partners in the Stolen Auto Strategy continues to pay constant attention to this issue.

Crimes Against the Person reflect a year-to-date decrease of [-134] incidents over September 2016 for a [-6.7%] decrease. There were 13 reported Robberies in September for a year-to-date decrease of [-69] incidents or a decrease of [-31.2%].

Overall the Regina Police Service received [-376] fewer reported incidents of Crimes Against the Person and Crimes Against Property combined in 2017 over 2016 for a [-3.2%] decrease.

There were a total of 7,489 dispatched Calls for Service in September for a year-to-date

increase of 0.8% and Alarm Calls for Service show a year-to-date increase of 0.3%.

I called 911 yesterday to report my child missing. I cannot say enough good things about the dispatcher who took my call, Marion from Reporting who helped me make my Missing Persons file, and the two officers who came to my house to help me locate my daughter.

On the most traumatic day of my life, all these people were here for me. The 911 dispatcher helped me stay calm because she was so calm and reassured me that police were on their way. Marion from Reporting, was calm and confident that we would find my daughter soon, which in turn made me calm and more sure that we would find her. And the 2 officers who came to help (I'm so sorry, I didn't get their names) were swift and non-judgemental about my plight. As I'm sure most parents feel when they lose their child, I felt like the worst mother and the female officer reassured me that they frequently get calls like this.

In total, my daughter was missing for 25 minutes. The longest and most painful 25 minutes of my life. And I have all of the above people to thank for helping me find my daughter. I am beyond grateful and I just wanted to take a minute to commend the Regina Police Service for your tireless work and protection you provide to our city. Please make sure that all of the people involved know just how thankful I am, if at all possible.
