CONCLUSION

The crime statistics for the month of October 2017 reflect a decrease in Crimes Against the Person of [-5.4%] compared to October 2016, while Crimes Against Property show a [-2.8%] decrease compared to October 2016. Crimes Against the Person and Crimes Against Property show a combined year-to-date decrease of [-3.2%].

BACKGROUND

Each month, reports providing statistics for the City of Regina are presented to the Board for their review and information. This report will provide statistics for the month of October 2017. The Communications Centre statistics are included showing the total calls for service.

DISCUSSION

Crimes Against Property reflect a decrease of [-300] reported incidents over 2016, for an overall year-to-date decrease of [-2.8%]. We have seen an increase of 315 reported incidents of Theft Under \$5,000 for a 6.8% increase. There are [-318] less reported incidents of Mischief / Wilful Damage for a [-12.8%] decrease.

Thefts of Auto rates have decreased by [-93] incidents for an overall decrease of [-9.8%] in our year-to-date statistics. The Regina Police Service in conjunction with its partners in the Stolen Auto Strategy continues to pay constant attention to this issue.

Crimes Against the Person reflect a year-to-date decrease of [-121] incidents over October 2016 for a [-5.4%] decrease. There were 15 reported Robberies in October for a year-to-date decrease of [-80] incidents or a decrease of [-32.3%].

Overall the Regina Police Service received [-421] fewer reported incidents of Crimes Against the Person and Crimes Against Property combined in 2017 over 2016 for a [-3.2%] decrease.

There were a total of 7,224 dispatched Calls for Service in October for a year-to-date increase

of 0.6% and Alarm Calls for Service show a year-to-date increase of 1.6%.

A change of scene or a change of pace is good for your mental health. It could be a five-minute pause from cleaning your bedroom, walking the dog, going for a run or a weekend exploring somewhere new with friends and family. A few minutes can be enough to do it.
- ACCEPT WHO YOU ARE**  
Some of us make people laugh, some are good at maths, others cook fantastic meals. Some of us share our lifestyle with the people who live close to us, others live very differently. We're all different and that's okay!
- KEEP ACTIVE**  
Exercise releases chemicals in your brain that make you feel good. Regular exercise can boost your self-esteem and help you concentrate, sleep, look and feel better. Exercise also keeps the brain and your other vital organs healthy.
- ASK FOR HELP**  
None of us are superhuman! We all sometimes get tired or overwhelmed by how we feel or when things go wrong. If things are getting too much for you and you feel you can't cope, **ask for help**.
- DO SOMETHING YOU'RE GOOD AT**  
What do you love doing? What activities can you lose yourself in? What did you love doing in the past? Enjoying yourself helps beat stress. Doing an activity you enjoy probably means you're good at it and achieving something boosts your self-esteem.
- CARE FOR OTHERS**  
Caring for others is often an important part of keeping up relationships with people close to you. It can even bring people closer together.
- CARE FOR YOURSELF!**
