### RECOMMENDATION

### **CONCLUSION**

The crime statistics for the month of October 2017 reflect a decrease in Crimes Against the Person of [-5.4%] compared to October 2016, while Crimes Against Property show a [-2.8%] decrease compared to October 2016. Crimes Against the Person and Crimes Against Property show a combined year-to-date decrease of [-3.2%].

#### **BACKGROUND**

Each month, reports providing statistics for the City of Regina are presented to the Board for their review and information. This report will provide statistics for the month of October 2017. The Communications Centre statistics are included showing the total calls for service.

### **DISCUSSION**

Crimes Against Property reflect a decrease of [-300] reported incidents over 2016, for an overall year-to-date decrease of [-2.8%]. We have seen an increase of 315 reported incidents of Theft Under \$5,000 for a 6.8% increase. There are [-318] less reported incidents of Mischief / Wilful Damage for a [-12.8%] decrease.

Thefts of Auto rates have decreased by [-93] incidents for an overall decrease of [-9.8%] in our year-to-date statistics. The Regina Police Service in conjunction with its partners in the Stolen Auto Strategy continues to pay constant attention to this issue.

Crimes Against the Person reflect a year-to-date decrease of [-121] incidents over October 2016 for a [-5.4%] decrease. There were 15 reported Robberies in October for a year-to-date decrease of [-80] incidents or a decrease of [-32.3%].

Overall the Regina Police Service received [-421] fewer reported incidents of Crimes Against the Person and Crimes Against Property combined in 2017 over 2016 for a [-3.2%] decrease.

There were a total of 7,224 dispatched Calls for Service in October for a year-to-date increase

of 0.6% and Alarm Calls for Service show a year-to-date increase of 1.6%.
