

Appendix B: CIGP Funding Definitions

CIGP Funding Program	Definition
Community Partner	The purpose of the Community Partner Program is to provide multi-year funding for core operations and core operating expenses towards programs/services to established non-profit organizations that play a unique, strategic and essential role in the City of Regina, and have the deepest and most meaningful impacts related to priorities in one of the CIGP's three funding streams (Culture, Social Development and Sport & Recreation).
CA Phase Funding	The purpose of the Community Association – Phase I, II, and III Program is designed to support Community Associations. The Program provides core operating and program/service support to non-profit neighbourhood organizations that address community quality of life issues and provide sport, culture, recreation and social development programs.
Annual Activity	The purpose of the Annual Activity program is to provide annual funding to organizations for reoccurring programs and services. This annual funding provides a sense of stability for organizations from year to year. The Annual Activity Program provides funding through three streams: Culture, Social Development and Sport & Recreation.
New Initiative	The purpose of the New Initiative program is to provide funding for new or one-time programs, projects, services, organizational development or capital initiatives. The New Initiative Program provides funding through three streams: Culture, Social Development and Sport & Recreation.
Winter Initiatives	The Winter Initiatives Grant supports initiatives that further the themes and goals of Regina's Winter City Strategy. The program aims to enhance Regina's winter-built environment and community inclusion, accessibility, and outdoor activity in the coldest months of the year.
Community Operating Centre	The City provides funding assistance to five City-owned community centres which are operated by community groups.
Zone Board	The City provides funding to Zone Boards to assist in delivering programs and services that address community quality of life issues and to provide sport, culture, recreation and social development programs. Each zone board is comprised of representation from the Community Associations within its boundaries and affiliated organizations.
Special Event Major	Special Event Major funding supports local large scale, one time or reoccurring events that celebrate, preserve and enhance Regina's identity.
Other	A project, service or event that is allocated funding through the Community Investment Program.
Adapted Sport & Recreation	The Adapted Sport & Recreation Grant was designed to support projects and initiatives that enhance inclusion and increase accessibility in sport and recreation for people with disabilities. This funding allows organizations to try something new, or make accessibility-related changes to existing programs, services, or facilities.
Harm Reduction	The Harm Reduction Grant was designed to promote the well-being of individuals and communities in Regina through increased access to harm reduction interventions. This funding will allow community-based organizations to fund existing or new harm reduction initiatives that support vulnerable community members, reduce harm associated with drug use in our city and that align with the City's Harm Reduction priorities.
